You can also fold up sales packaging made from cardboard. Avoid unnecessary paper waste by placing a "No adverts" sticker on your letterbox.</p>

Some types of refuse are collected at other disposal facilities, like waste glass, waste textile and green waste containers, composting facilities, recycling centres, bulky waste collection and hazardous waste collection points.

All recycling centres accept small electrical and electronic devices up to 50 centimetres in length for free. The recycling centres at Nordbeckenstraße 1 and Maybachstraße 10 b accept large appliances for free. Large electrical appliances (ovens, stoves, fridges and freezers, dryers, washing machine) can be collected upon request. Small appliances can also be collected at the same time free of charge.
