The list above is not exhaustive. A few types of waste are collected via other disposal facilities, such as glass, textiles, green waste containers, compost heaps, recycling stations, household waste collection and harmful substance collection points. Old electronics and electronic devices up to 35 cm edge length can be handed in at all recycling stations and large devices at the recycling stations at Nordbeckenstrasse 1 and Maybachstrasse 10 b free of charge. Large electronic devices (fridges, freezers, washing machines, dryers, cookers, ovens) are collected on request.
